What is Gastro Intestinal (GI) Cancer?

It is a term for the group of cancers that affect the digestive system. This includes cancers of the oesophagus, gallbladder, liver, pancreas, stomach, small intestine, bowel (large intestine or colon and rectum), and anus. GI Cancers do not discriminate between men and women. In India, it is the third largest type of cancer found in men and fourth largest found in women.

What are Thoracic Malignancies ?

Thoracic malignancies includes cancer of esophagus, lung and mediastinum (all cancers within the rib cage).

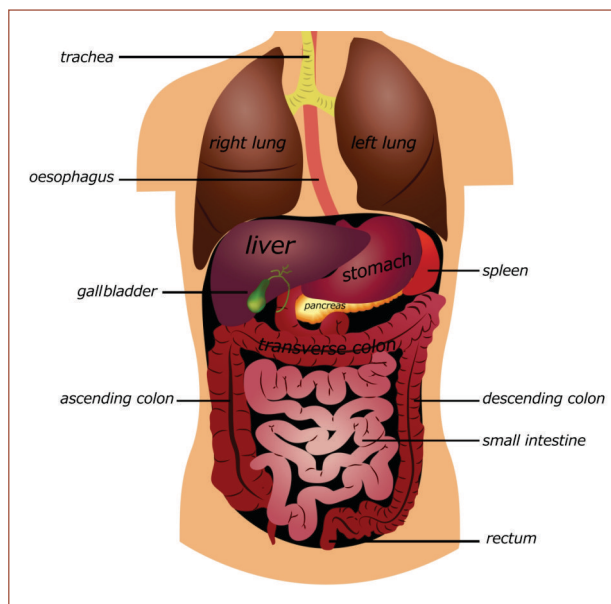
What are the symptoms of GI and Thoracic Cancer?

Tumours formed due to these cancer might not show any symptoms unless they are in a certain location or grow to a certain size. Small tumours might not show any symptoms and may be found accidentally when the doctor is looking for some other problem. The symptoms relate to the organ affected and can include obstruction (leading to difficulty in swallowing or defecating), abnormal bleeding or other associated problems.

Main Symptoms:

- Blood loss
- Abdominal (belly) discomfort or pain
- A mass or swelling in the abdomen
- Nausea, vomiting
- Feeling full after eating only a small amount of food
- Loss of appetite
- Weight loss
- Swallowing problems (for tumours in the Oesophagus)

GI and Thoracic System



- Blood in sputum
- Chronic cough

Are you at risk for getting GI and Thoracic Cancer?

The major risk factors are :

- Smoking and consumption of alcohol
- Infection with bacteria known as H.pylori, known to cause ulcers in the stomach
- Heavy consumption of smoked meat, fish and food with high quantity of salt
- Recent study has shown that obesity is a predisposing risk factor

How often should you be screened for GI and Thoracic Cancer?

A colonoscopy is advised after the age of 50 Colon cancer is a preventable cancer and hence regularly screening is advise. Ask our doctors if you need earlier or more frequent screening or additional tests.

What are the treatments for GI and Thoracic Cancer?

If you have Gastro Intestinal or Thoracic Cancer, our doctors will discuss your treatment options with you. To make an informed choice, ask about the pros and cons of each option, potential side effects, and how effective the treatment is likely to be. There are several ways to treat these cancers, depending on the type and stage, including:

- Surgery (Robotic, Laparoscopy and Open)
- Chemotherapy
- Radiation therapy
- Endoscopic management
